Graduate Executive

Last quarter the GEC organized the department Halloween party. Our goal was to encourage community growth after being virtual for so long and to officially welcome all the first and second year grad students to campus. In fall, the GEC also began planning and organizing the upcoming social events for this quarter (please see above), in addition to this newsletter. We hope this quarter's social events will provide opportunities to continue to build a strong PBS community. Additionally, we hope this newsletter and committee updates will help to foster a culture of transparency, openness, and communication within the department.

About This Committee: This committee oversees internal projects, social media accounts, and organizes social events.

Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion

The DEIC accomplished 5 key items in Fall 2021. First, the DEIC developed a strategy to implement elements of the UCOP faculty diversity grant awarded to Shelly Gable last year. This included: a) Selecting Alisa Bedrov for the GSA position attached to this grant. b) Identifying senior scholars to invite to the senior speaker series. Two invitations have gone out so far, and our first speaker (Stephanie Fryberg) is scheduled to visit in April 2022. c) Coordinated with Alisa Bedrov to identify recipients of the UC Presidential Postdoctoral Fellowship program to invite to a speaker series. So far one invitation has been sent out (responses pending). Second, the DEIC developed a plan to update/create the diversity information on the PBS website. We met with the LSCF web designer Brian Wolf and have had him create a prototype microsite that will replace the existing 'JEDI' tab on the PBS website. We will be working on developing this site early in Winter 2022 and hope to have it launched during Winter quarter. Third, the DEIC discussed the PBS Graduate Student Faculty Mentor program and made recommendations to the Graduate Affairs committee about the creation of some guidelines for mentors/mentees to clarify the goals and expectations of participants in this program. Fourth, the DEIC developed an analysis plan for the PBS climate survey administered in Spring 2021. The analysis of the data is underway, with Dan Conroy-Beam taking the lead. Finally, representatives from the committee attended the two monthly meetings of Diversity Officers and attended a training session on best practice for equitable search committees, all run by the office of the Vice Chancellor for Diversity Equity and Inclusion.

Graduate Admissions

The Graduate Admissions Committee consists of Dan Conroy-Beam, Courney Durdle (Graduate Student Representative), Michael Goard, Richard Mayer (Chair), Katherine Lowe (Staff Representative), Chris McFerron (Staff Representative), Sophie Peterson (Graduate Student Representative), and Kyle Ratner. We are pleased to report that the Department received approximately 300 applications for our PhD program this year. In December, the Committee began the process of determining how to allocate recruitment slots to interested faculty, based on the Department's procedures and our target class size. Due to recent changes in campus fellowships, the Committee will determine which prospective students will be granted a Central Fellowship in January. Our Interview Day (or Recruitment Day) will be on Friday, February 11, and is likely to be a virtual event this year. We look forward to everyone's participation in this important Departmental event. We also look forward to recruiting another excellent incoming class of outstanding students.

Undergraduate Experience
